

#### FROM THE DIRECTOR


Cabaret first appeared in the world in 1966 only twenty one years after the end of World War II. People in the audience had living memory of the issues in the play. It wasn't just a look back at a different time but a wary look forward as well. Over the decades since that opening, Cabaret has enjoyed a film adaptation and three revivals on Broadway, each with a radical reinterpretation of the show. It is the rare example of a piece of theatre art that has evolved and retained its power to remain relevant. With a rich score of memorable songs, it manages to be both enjoyable and prescient. Eleven years after our own production here at Cygnet Theatre, we still find it fresh and packed with ideas and messages. While always a truly entertaining piece, it is perhaps unfortunate that this show also is and will most likely always be a relevant reminder of the dangers of rising fascism around us and poses the question: "With a storm in the wind, what would you do?"







# The History of **CABARET**



#### From Camera...

The musical *Cabaret* is based on John Van Druten's 1951 play *I Am a Camera*, which in turn was adapted from the novel *Goodbye to Berlin* by Christopher Isherwood. The story is set in 1931 Berlin as the Nazis are rising to power, and it focuses on nightlife at the seedy Kit Kat Klub. In particular, the story revolves around the 19-year-old English cabaret performer Sally Bowles and her relationship with the young American writer Cliff Bradshaw.

A sub-plot involves the doomed romance between German boarding house owner Fräulein Schneider and her elderly suitor Herr Schultz, a Jewish fruit vendor. Overseeing the action is the Master of Ceremonies at the Kit Kat Klub. This character, referred to as the Emcee, serves as a constant metaphor for the tenuous and threatening state of late Weimar Germany throughout the show.

#### To Stage...

The theatrical phenomena of *Cabaret* made Kander and Ebb a major name on the Broadway scene, but the musical credits nearly went to another composer. Sandy Wilson, who had achieved success with the Broadway musical *The Boy Friend* in the 1950s, had completed the book and most of the score for Goodbye to Berlin, 6

his musicalization of *I Am a Camera*. Unfortunately for Wilson, producer David Black's option on both the 1951 Van Druten play and its source material by Christopher Isherwood lapsed and was acquired by Harold Prince. Prince commissioned Joe Masteroff to work on the book, and when the two men agreed Wilson's score failed to capture the essence of late-1920s Berlin, John Kander and Fred Ebb were invited to join the project.

The new version was initially a dramatic play. Before each scene, a song was performed to describe the Berlin atmosphere from a different point of view. As Kander and Ebb began to distribute the songs between scenes, they realized the story could be told in the structure of a more traditional book musical, and they replaced some of the songs with tunes more relevant to the plot. The juxtaposition of dialogue scenes with songs used as exposition and separate cabaret numbers providing social commentary was a novel concept that initially startled the audience, but Cabaret's on-going success is a tribute to the successful construct.

After 21 previews, the original Broadway production, directed by Harold Prince and choreographed by Ron Field, opened on November 20, 1966 at the Broadhurst

Theatre, eventually transferring first to the Imperial and then the Broadway before finally completing its 1,165-performance run. The opening night cast included Jill Haworth as Sally, Bert Convy as Cliff and Joel Grey as the Emcee.

#### To Screen...

In 1972, Cabaret was turned into a musical film directed by Bob Fosse and starring Liza Minnelli, Michael York and Joel Grey. Fosse had fought hard to win the position of Director. Chief Executives had wanted a bigger name, but ultimately Fosse's immense talent for staging and shooting musical numbers got him hired. There was concern that another director might give inordinate attention to filming the book scenes at the expense of the musical numbers and the film would fail.



Producer Cy Feuer had cast Liza Minnelli as Sally Bowles (a role previously denied her in the stage version) and Joel Grey (reprising his stage role) long before Fosse was attached to the project. Fosse hired Michael York as Sally Bowles' openly bisexual love interest.

The film differs significantly from the Broadway musical. To accommodate Minnelli, Sally Bowles is Americanized. The character of Cliff Bradshaw was renamed Brian Roberts and made British and bisexual. New characters and plot lines were added and the movie did not utilize the Broadway convention of special settings to separate the fantasy world of the Cabaret from the darker rest of the world. Another difference...Fosse cut several of the songs, leaving only those that are sung

within the confines of the Kit Kat Klub, and "Tomorrow Belongs to Me" - sung in a beer garden. Kander and Ebb wrote several new songs for the movie and removed others; "Don't Tell Mama" was replaced by "Mein Herr," and "The Money Song" was replaced by "Money, Money," Interestingly, "Mein Herr" and "Money, Money," which were composed for the film version, have, due to their popularity, now been added to performances of the Stage Musical alongside the original numbers.

#### **Broadway Revival** (1987)...

The first Broadway revival, again directed by Prince and choreographed by Field, opened on October 22, 1987 at the Imperial Theatre, eventually transferring to the Minskoff to complete its 261-performance run. Joel Grey received star billing as the Emcee. The song "Don't Go" was added for Cliff's character.

#### **Broadway Revival** (1998)...

The second Broadway revival was based on the 1993 Sam Mendes-directed Donmar Warehouse production from London. Co-directed by Mendes and Rob Marshall and choreographed by Marshall, it opened on March 19, 1998 at the Kit Kat Klub, housed in what previously had been known as Henry Miller's Theatre. Later that year it transferred to Studio 54, where it remained for the rest of its 2377-performance run, becoming the third longest-running revival in Broadway musical history. In addition to Alan Cumming as the Emcee, the original cast included a Tony Award winning performance by Natasha Richardson as Sally.

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


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
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
